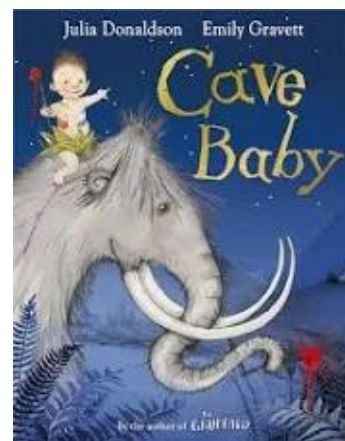


# Infants Autumn Term 1.1

## Art and Design (EAD)

### Reception

- 1.1 - I can explore what happens when colours are mixed.
- 1.2 - I understand that different media can be combined for different effects.
- 1.3 - I can create simple representations of events, people and objects.
- 1.4 - I can choose particular colours to use for a purpose.
- 1.5 - I can safely use and explore materials, tools and techniques.
- 1.6 - I can experiment with colour, design, texture and form.
- 1.7 - I can represent my own ideas, thoughts and feelings through art.

### Year One

#### Drawing

- 1.1 - I can match and draw lines/ shapes from observations.
- 1.2 - I can draw on different surfaces using a range of media.
- 1.3 - I can explore different textures by rubbing, describing and copying.
- 1.4 - I can draw light/ dark lines and patterns.

#### Printing

### Year Two

#### Drawing (Illustrators Paul Howard, Patricia Benson)

- 1.1 - I can use a range of mark makers to produce/ invent new shapes from observations.
- 1.2 - I can draw as a way of recording experiences and feelings.
- 1.3 - I can create a range of tones (using graded drawing pencils/ charcoal).
- 1.4 - I can experiment with different media.

#### Printing

- 2.1 - I can print with a growing range of objects.
- 2.2 - I can build repeating patterns and design them.
- 2.3 - I can create simple printing blocks.
- 2.4 - I can use printing ink on found objects to create patterns.

## Geography (UW)

### Reception

- 1.1 - I can look closely at patterns, similarities/ differences and change.
- 1.2 - I can talk about features of my own environment.
- 1.3 - I can talk about how environments may vary from one another.

### Year One

- 1.1 - I can keep a weather chart and answer questions about the weather.
- 1.2 - I can explain where I live and tell someone my address.
- 1.3 - I can explain some of the main things that are in hot and cold places.
- 1.4 - I can explain the clothes that I would wear in hot and cold places.
- 1.5 - I can explain how weather changes throughout the year and name the seasons.
- 1.6 - I can name the four countries in the United Kingdom and locate them on a map.
- 1.7 - I can name some of the main towns and cities in the United Kingdom.

### Year Two

- 1.1 - I can say what I like and what I do not like about the place I live.
- 1.2 - I can say what I like and what I dislike about a different place.
- 1.3 - I can describe a place outside Europe using geographical words.
- 1.4 - I can describe the key features of a place from a picture, using words like beach, coast, forest, hill, mountain, ocean, valley.
- 1.5 - I can explain how jobs may be different in another location.
- 1.11 - I can find where I live on a map of the United Kingdom.

## History (UW)

### Reception

- I can talk about past and present events in my life and the lives of family members (1.1)
- I know about similarities and in differences in traditions (1.2)

### Year One

- 1.1 - I can use phrases like: old, new and long time ago.
- 1.2 - I recognise that some objects belong to the past.
- 1.3 - I can explain how I have changed since I was born.
- 1.4 - I can explain how some people have helped us to have better lives.
- 1.5 - I can ask and answer questions about old and new objects.
- 1.6 - I can spot old and new things in a picture.
- 1.7 - I can explain what an object from the past might have been used for.

### Year Two

- 1.1 - I can use words and phrases like: before, after, past, present, then and now.
- 1.2 - I can recount the life of someone famous from Britain who lived in the past. I can explain what they did earlier and what they did later.
- 1.3 - I can give examples of things that were different when my grandparents were children.
- 1.4 - I can find out things about the past by talking to an older person.
- 1.5 - I can answer questions about books and the internet.

## Music (EAD)

### Reception

- 1.1 - I can begin to build a repertoire of songs.
- 1.2 - I can explore the different sounds of instruments.
- 1.3 - I can sing songs and make music.
- 1.4 - I can experiment with ways of changing songs and music.

### Year One

#### Listening

- 1.1 - I can say whether I like or dislike a piece of music.
- 1.2 - I can respond to different moods in music.

#### Composing

- 2.1 - I can choose sounds to represent different things.
- 2.2 - I can make a sequence of sounds.

#### Performing

- 3.1 - I can repeat short rhythmic and melodic patterns.
- 3.5 - I can clap short rhythmical patterns.
- 3.6 - I can use my voice to speak, sing and chant.

### Year Two

#### Listening

- 1.1 - I can listen out for particular things when listening to music.
- 1.2 - I can make connections between notations and musical sounds.

#### Performing

- 3.1 - I can sing or clap with increasing and decreasing tempo.
- 3.2 - I can play simple rhythmic patterns on an untuned instrument.
- 3.3 - I can perform simple pattern and accompaniments – keeping a steady pulse.
- 3.4 - I can sing and follow a melody.

## P.E. (PD)

### Reception

- 4.1 - I know the importance of good health and physical exercise.
- 4.2 - I can talk about ways to keep healthy and safe.
- 3.1 - I can travel with confidence and skill in a variety of situations.
- 3.2 - I can create dances and experiments with ways to change the dance.
- 3.3 - I can represent my own thoughts and feelings through dance.

### Year One

#### General

- 4.1 - I can copy actions.
- 4.2 - I can repeat actions and skills.
- 4.3 - I can move with control and care.
- 4.4 - I can use equipment safely.

#### Dance

- 3.1 - I can move to music.
- 3.2 - I can copy dance moves.
- 3.3 - I can perform my own dance moves.
- 3.4 - I can make up a short dance.
- 3.5 - I can move safely in a space.

### Year Two

#### Dance

- 3.1 - I can change rhythm, speed, level and direction in my dance.
- 3.2 - I can dance with control and coordination.
- 3.3 - I can make a sequence by linking sections together.
- 3.4 - I can use dance to show a mood or feeling.

#### General

- 4.1 - I can copy and remember actions.
- 4.2 - I can talk about what is different from what I did and what someone else did.

## R.E. (UW)

### Reception

- 1.1 - I enjoy joining in with family customs and routine.
- 1.2 - I know some of the things that make me unique.
- 1.3 - I can talk about some of the similarities and differences between myself and my friends/ family.
- 1.4 - I can recognise and describe special times or events.
- 1.5 - I know about similarities and differences among families, communities and traditions.

### Year One and Year Two

#### Learning About Religions and Belief

- 1.1 - I can use some religious words and phrases to recognise and name features of religious life and practice.
- 1.2 - I can recall religious stories and recognise symbols, and other verbal or visual forms of religious expression.

#### Learning From Religions and Belief

- 2.1 - I can talk about my experience and feelings in relation to religion and belief.
- 2.2 - I can talk about what I find interesting or puzzling in relation to religion and belief.
- 2.3 - I can talk about what is of value and concern to myself and to others.

## RSHE (PSED, UW)

### Theme: Drug Education

### Reception

- 1.1 - I can explain the reasons for rules, know right from wrong and try to behave accordingly.
- 1.2 - I can see myself as a valuable individual.
- 1.3 - I know and talk about the different factors that support my overall health and wellbeing.

### Year One and Year Two

#### Knowledge:

- 1.1 - I can explore the role of medicines (that we use when we are ill/ prevent illness/ manage a condition.)
- 1.2 - I can understand that household products, including medicines, can be harmful if not used properly.

#### Managing Risk:

- 2.1 - I can explore that medicines come in different forms and are used in different ways.
- 2.2 - I understand that things that people put into their body or on their skin can affect how they feel.
- 2.3 - I can talk about some simple rules for staying safe around medicines and other household substances/products.
- 2.4 - I can identify people that I can go to if I am ill, worried or to help me/others to stay healthy.

## Science (UW)

### Theme: Animals including Humans

### Reception

- 1.1 - I can talk about members of my immediate family and community.
- 1.2 - I can name and describe people who are familiar to me.
- 1.3 - I can recognise some environments that are different to the one in which I live.
- 1.4 - I can explore the natural world around me.
- 1.5 - I can describe what I see, hear and feel using my senses.

### Year One and Year Two

- 1.1 - I can talk about members of my immediate family and community.
- 1.2 - I can name and describe people who are familiar to me.
- 1.3 - I can recognise some environments that are different to the one in which I live
- 1.4 - I can identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
- 1.6 - I can describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, including pets).
- 1.7 - I can identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.

## Speaking and Listening (CL)

### Reception

- 1.1 - I can maintain attention and concentrate, sitting quietly during a range of situations.
  - 1.2 - I can listen and do for a short period of time.
  - 1.3 - I can listen to stories accurately, accurately anticipating key events.
  - 1.4 - I can respond to what I hear with relevant comments, questions or actions.
  - 1.5 - I can give my attention to what others say and respond appropriately.
  - 2.1 - I can follow instructions involving several ideas or actions.
  - 2.2 - I can follow and talk about a story without pictures or props.
  - 2.3 - I can listen to and respond to ideas by others in conversation or discussion.
  - 2.4 - I can answer 'How' and 'Why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories and events.
  - 3.1 - I can extend vocabulary by grouping and naming, explore the sounds and meanings of new words.
  - 3.2 - I can use language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in play situations.
  - 3.3 - I can link statements in order to stick to a main theme or intention.
  - 3.4 - I can use talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.
  - 3.5 - I can introduce a story line or narrative into their play.
  - 3.6 - I can express myself effectively showing awareness of the listeners needs.
- I can use past, present and future forms accurately when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future (3.7)
- I can develop my own narratives and explanations by connecting ideas and events (3.8)

### Year One

- 1.1 - I can ask questions to clarify or develop my understanding.
- 1.2 - I can sequence, develop and communicate ideas in an organised and logical way, always using complete sentences.
- 1.3 - I show that I understand the main point and the details in a discussion.
- 1.4 - I adapt what I am saying to the needs of the listener or audience (increasingly).
- 1.5 - I show that I know that language choices vary in different contexts.
- 1.6 - I can present to an audience using appropriate intonation; controlling the tone and volume so that the meaning is clear.
- 1.7 - I can justify an answer by giving evidence.
- 1.8 - I use standard English when it is required.
- 1.9 - I can perform poems or plays from memory, conveying ideas about characters and situations by adapting expression and tone.

### Year Two

- 1.1 - I can ask questions to get more information and clarify meaning.
- 1.2 - I can talk in complete sentences.
- 1.3 - I can decide when I need to use specific vocabulary.
- 1.4 - I can take turns when talking in pairs or a small group.
- 1.5 - I am beginning to be aware that formal and informal situations require different language.
- 1.6 - I can re-tell a story using narrative language and linking words and phrases.
- 1.7 - I can hold the attention of people I am speaking to by adapting the way I talk.
- 1.8 - I am beginning to understand how to speak for different purposes and audiences.
- 1.9 - I can perform a simple poem from memory.
